Regan Jones, Director of the Office of Military and Veterans Affairs



Regan Jones is the director for military and veterans affairs and provides strategic direction on behalf of the provost for the University's defense, military, and veteran-related programs, teaches a graduate-level leadership class, and is an affiliate fellow with Notre Dame's International Security Center.

Jones, a career infantry officer, currently serves with the Defense Innovation Unit. During his military career, he completed combat deployments to Iraq and non-combat deployments to the Indo-Pacific and East African theaters of operation, and when not deployed overseas, he was involved in all aspects of Marine Corps training and education.

A former Division I athlete, Jones holds an undergraduate degree in political science from the University at Albany, an M.B.A. from Florida State University, and is a graduate of the President George W. Bush Institute Leadership Program.
